8. Discussion, Consideration and any Action Regarding Results of the 2021 Summer Conference Survey and Whether to Hold the Conference Virtually or in Person. – Stacey Kemp, President.

Discussion in reference to the summer conference was held. Luz Hinojosa provided the results of the survey that was sent out in reference to holding the conference in person. Stacey Kemp went over those results by reading them out loud. Discussion followed.

MOTION was made by: **Brenda McKanna**: Motion to approve holding the Summer Conference in person in Amarillo 2021.

9. Discussion, Consideration and any Action Regarding Grant Reimbursement Options – Michele Mund, TAC.

Michele Mund, provided grant update. The grant total is \$224,927.00 and Michele recommends that we utilize the grant to the fullest due to the Summer Conference being the only one we can use it on this grant year. Michele recommended a four-night reimbursement at \$110.40 per night plus the travel expenses. Michele and Luz did caution against using a third party provider for airline tickets if reimbursement was going to be requested. Normally these providers do not provide the detailed receipt that is required for reimbursement.

MOTION was made by: Laura Hinojosa: Motion to give the absolute max reimbursement for the conference.

SECOND was made by: **Velva Price**. None opposed, motion carried.

Discussion followed in reference to making sure the Regional Directors get the word out in reference to taking advantage of the grant reimbursement. Rental of cars by the membership is also encouraged.

MOTION was made by: **Velva Price**: I make a motion, for this 2021 Summer Conference only, that we waive the CDCAT restriction for rental cars and airline tickets.

SECOND was made by: Melissa Mead.

None opposed, motion carried.

Sarah Lazarowitz with Zachary Publications. provided an update as to where we are on vendor sponsorship. Currently we have \$71,400.00 committed which includes 22 booths. There is an option to have a higher pipe and drape between booths which would increase the registration fee by \$8.00. The general consensus was to provide additional privacy/protection for each vendor. This will add to our decorator contract. No action was needed on this update. Sarah will get an updated contract to Stacey for her signature.

10. Discussion, Consideration and any Action Regarding Increasing Registration Fees for the Summer Conference – Stacey Kemp, President

Sam Burke discussed prior registration fees from various summer conferences. Patti Henry discussed budget impact in reference to setting the registration fees. Various amounts were discussed and discussion was held.
